Introduction:

The Wildlife Conservation Society (WCS) is a US non-profit private organization established in 1895 that saves wildlife and wild places by understanding critical issues, crafting science-based solutions, and taking conservation actions that benefit nature and humanity.

In Mozambique, WCS partners with the Government of Mozambique in the comanagement of Niassa Special Reserve (42,000km²) where widespread uncontrolled wildfires are a regular and significant management issue.

Background:

In 2004 and 2006, a collaborative effort between SGDRN and the Niassa Carnivore Project (NCP) led to the development of a standardized and repeatable protocol for surveying the Lugenda Fishery. This protocol was implemented along the Lugenda River in 2004 and 2006, as well as along the Ruvuma River in 2009. The upcoming survey will utilize this established protocol to reassess the state of the Lugenda River fishery two decades later, incorporating additional data on fish catches collected continuously since 2004/06.

Objective:

The primary objective is to conduct a comprehensive ecological and socio-ecological survey of the Lugenda River and its associated tributaries within the Niassa Special

Reserve in Mozambique. The survey aims to compare the current data with the detailed baseline information gathered in 2004 and 2006 along the Lugenda River.

Deliverables:

A team comprising six individuals, including representatives from NSR, SDAE (local agricultural department), the consultant, and local fishermen, will conduct a month-long canoe survey from July to September 2024 (subject to river levels). The survey will encompass the Lugenda River and its tributaries, allowing for a comprehensive assessment of the area's ecological and socio-ecological dynamics.

- 1. The primary activity will be to collect data on:
 - Densities and distribution of fishing camps and the numbers and origins of fishermen and traders utilizing the Lugenda River compared to 2006.
 - Economic information on the current value of commercial dried fish species.
 - Ecological information on the distribution of key river indicator species of birds, crocodiles and hippos to compare to 2006.
 - Level of human-crocodile conflict to compare to baseline data.
 - Additional surveying in identified tributaries.
 - Traditional knowledge of the life cycle of commercially targeting species.
 - Traditional management systems.
- 2. Data mapped to create a visual representation of the Lugenda Fishery to inform zoning and resource use plans that support biodiversity conservation, the sustainability of the Lugenda Fishery and human wellbeing.
- 3. Analyse fish catch data collected by Mariri / NCP from 2004 to 2024 to assess changes in fish size and fish catches over time from one of the most heavily fished areas of the Lugenda River in south-eastern NSR.
- 4. Produce a detailed report with maps by project end.

Requirements

- Master's or a higher degree in ecology or natural resource management field
- Minimum of 15 years' experience in ecology/ biodiversity conservation with emphasis on fisheries and aquaculture management.
- Extensive knowledge of protected area management issues and objectives in southern African or comparable settings
- Excellent oral and written skills in English and working knowledge of Portuguese.

Content: All proposals must:

 - o Full legal name, jurisdiction of incorporation, and address of the company.
 - Full legal name and country of citizenry of company's President, Chief Executive Officer, and/or all other principal officers of the company.
 - o The year that the business was established.
- If a consortium of firms or a team of consultants submits a proposal jointly, the above information should be provided for each member of the team.
